




Drug Use in the U.S. is Widely Criminalized






Making the U.S. an International Outlier

overdose








Public Views Are Shifting



Newly elected prosecutors are playing a unique role in advancing harm reduction interventions








Moving from Criminalization to Harm Reduction

Why Prosecutors?

 Prosecutors have significant power and discretion to decline to proceed with charges



- Local-level policies drive the US criminal justice system and are especially important in the face of heightened enforcement at the federal level
- Elected prosecutors have unique credibility on public safety issues and can advocate for reforms
