About the College

In 1965, President G. Homer Durham hired Willard H. Pedrick to become Arizona State University's first law school dean and tasked him with the responsibility of building, literally from the ground up, its very first law school. Located on ASU's Tempe campus, Armstrong Hall housed the law school until its move to the Downtown Phoenix campus in 2016.

In 1970, the first class of 83 students graduated with their Juris Doctor from ASU Law. Today, more than 650 students graduate annually, receiving one or more of our five degrees: Juris Doctor (JD), Master of Laws (LLM), Master of Legal Studies (MLS), Master of Human Resources and Employment Law (MHREL), or Master of Sports Law and Business (MSLB). The law school has accomplished many significant milestones in its 50+ years. In 2006, the law school was renamed to honor **Justice**Sandra Day O'Connor, the first woman appointed to the Supreme Court of the United States. It is a privilege—and a great responsibility—to be entrusted with the late Justice O'Connor's name and legacy.

In 2016, ASU Law moved to the Beus Center for Law and Society in the ASU Downtown Phoenix campus, further enhancing the law school's service to the community and providing students access to the best legal opportunities. Students can also study beyond Phoenix at ASU locations in Los Angeles and Washington, D.C., as well as participate in global study abroad with externship or internship opportunities.

ASU Law's world-class faculty and administrators provide students with unparalleled opportunities to gain insights and practical skills needed to address legal challenges locally, nationally and globally. ASU Law also prides itself on its network of engaged alumni and its relationship to the broader legal community, which has fully embraced the law school and is dedicated to the success of its graduates. With plans to pursue a JD next fall, **Margaret Zahm** adds the Master of Legal Studies to her growing portfolio of achievements. Zahm previously graduated with distinction from the University of Michigan, obtaining a bachelor's degree in sociology and a minor in Russian. Driven by an intense curiosity about the law and society, she has assisted with numerous research projects, from those focused on building transnational LGBTQ+ networks in South Korea to the relationship between state repression and military service in twentieth-century Russia. As a high school teacher, she aims to instill a similar intellectual curiosity within her students, providing them with an equitable learning environment that will enable them to critically evaluate the world around them. Zahm credits her ASU Law faculty and fellow students with challenging her to continually seek out new perspectives and ideas when approaching all areas of the law.

Convocation Address......Gary Marchant

Regents and Foundation Professor of Law; Faculty Director, Center for Law, Science and Innovation, Sandra Day O'Connor College of Law, Arizona State University

Gary Marchant, Ph.D., JD, M.P.P., is Regents Professor and Faculty Director of the Center for Law, Science and Innovation at the Sandra Day O'Connor College of Law at Arizona State University. Marchant's research interests include the governance of emerging technologies such as genomics, biotechnology, nanotechnology, artificial intelligence, neuroscience, quantum technology and blockchain.

Prior to joining ASU in 1999, Marchant was a partner at the Washington, D.C., office of Kirkland & Ellis. During law school, he was editor-in-chief of the Harvard Journal of Law & Technology and editor of the Harvard Environmental Law Review and was awarded the Fay Diploma (awarded to top graduating students at Harvard Law School).

He has authored more than 200 articles, books and book chapters on various issues relating to emerging technologies. He has served on seven National Academies of Science, Engineering and Medicine (NASEM) consensus committees (chairing two), and has been elected as a lifetime member of the American Law Institute and a Fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science. He also chairs the IEEE Working Group (P2863) to create a governance standard for entities that develop or use artificial intelligence.
