CIVIL LITIGATION CLINIC

Students attorneys in the Civil Litigation Clinic are certified by the Arizona Supreme Court to represent clients who do not have adequate resources to hire an attorney in cases such as:

- Consumer Fraud
- Employment Discrimination & Wage Claims
- Tenant's Rights

Student attorneys are involved in all aspects of civil and administrative practice including interviewing and counseling clients, fact investigation, drafting pleadings, motions and appellate briefs, conducting discovery, and representing clients in trials, arbitration, and mediation. Student attorneys may also present oral arguments in appellate courts.

Course Information

The Civil Litigation Clinic is a one semester course.

Credits: Six graded credits

Grading Criteria: grading rubrics assessing diligence, thoroughness, representation, and classroom participation are provided at the beginning of the semester.

Pre- or Co-Requisite(s): Evidence, Professional Responsibility, Civil

Procedure and Criminal Law.

Time Commitment

Students are expected to spend a minimum of 270 hours in the Clinic during the one semester.

- Fall or Spring Semester 20 hours per week
- Summer Semester 27 hours per week

Included in those hours is a mandatory seminar class of a minimum of five hours per week.
