How Do I Vote in the Presidential Preference Election?

- You must be registered to vote. Only the Arizona Democratic Party is having a preference election so you must be registered with that party to vote in the preference election.
- You will need to bring identification to vote early in person or at the polls on election day. You do not need identification if you are voting by mail.
 - Tribal IDs are a valid form of identification when voting. If your Tribal ID has a photo and an address that reasonably matches the address that you are registered to vote at then you are entitled to a standard ballot. If your Tribal ID does not have a photo/address on it then you are entitled to a provisional ballot. This ballot will be counted once the county verifies that you are registered to vote and you voted at the correct poling location.
- You can drop off your mail in ballot at any polling location on election day as long as that polling location is in the county where you are registered to vote. Your mail in ballot must be received by 7:00 p.m. on March 17 so mail in your ballot days in advance to ensure the post office gets it to your county elections department on time.
